For every choice a student makes there is a consequence. Our goal is to move students toward a keener sense of self-awareness and a consistent practice of self-discipline.

Merits are awarded to encourage the development of student talent, to create a healthy spirit of competition, to promote school spirit and to reward those who excel in various fields.

Demerits are assigned for infractions of school rules. These are given by the school administration.

Other discipline methods include (not exhaustive): time-out, loss of privileges, counseling, detention, suspension and expulsion. Parents will be notified.

Honour Roll is for students who excel in their academic work. This is based on grade point average and letter grades.

It is our goal to reach all children and help them achieve their fullest purpose academically, spiritually and socially. That is why we aim to celebrate them in the classroom, on the field or stage and for their extra-curricular activities.

IDENTITY

Kingsway Academy is an interdenominational Christian day school which leads the way in providing "whole-person" education with Biblical values from kindergarten through high school.

The school is governed by a Bahamian Committee of Management (COM).

It is an incorporated, non-profit company registered with the Ministry of Education of The Bahamas. School memberships include Association of Christian Schools International (ACSI) and the Bahamas Association of Independent Secondary Schools (BAISS).

CAMPUS

The elementary school facilities include spacious classrooms for Kindergarten 3 to Grade 6, as well as a Computer Lab; Music, Spanish & Art Rooms; a Reading Room; Library; Physical Education Field and Court, and a multi-purpose auditorium.

In addition to regular classrooms, the high school is equipped with Science and Computer Labs, as well as accommodations for Home Economics, Vocational & Technical subjects. The Guidance Center is equipped for single-class instruction or group sessions and training. The cafeteria services both schools for snacks and hot lunches.

ABOUT US

Kingsway Academy was established in 1959 with only four kindergarten students. The

Tatham family wanted to bring Christian Education to the families in New Providence. Under the vision and direction of pioneers such as, Mrs. Grace Tatham-Kemp, Mr. Ned Wallace and Mr. Herbert Treco the school flourished.

In 1967 it moved from the small two-storey home on Dowdeswell Street to its present 10-acre property on Bernard Road. It also progressed to providing high school education, celebrating its first graduation class in June 1984.

In 1999, the school revised its mission and vision with a new school board and school administrative team. The revamping of curriculum and programs led to outstanding national and international recognition.

In 2009, on its 50th golden jubilee anniversary the school celebrated the men and women who had sacrificed time, talent and sometimes treasure to ensure that children were trained in the King's way of Godly character and excellent academics. To date, Kingsway Academy continues to grow in size, enhancing its programs and activities and building new infrastructure; all while maintaining a wholesome family atmosphere.



ADMISSION PROCEDURES

A completed application package includes:

- * Completed and signed application form
- * \$30.00 application fee
- * A transcript is required for Grades 1 - 6
- * Copied Immunization Record
- * Copied Birth Certificate & Passport
- * Recent passport-sized photo
- * National Insurance Number
- * Signed Parent Agreement Form
- * Completed Kingsway Health Record Form (will be given after interview)

Kindergarten Age Requirements:

- * Students entering K3 must be 3 yrs by Oct. 31
- * Students entering K4 must be 4 yrs by Dec. 31
- * Students entering K5 must be 5 yrs by Dec. 31

All incoming students are required to sit an entrance examination.

- * K3 and K4 will take an oral test.
- * Grades 1-6 will be contacted for the purpose of scheduling a placement test. Successful applicants will be offered a place as space is available.
- * An interview with the School's Administration will follow.
- * Upon acceptance of the student, a \$150.00 enrollment and seat fee must be submitted to the Business Office. (This is non-refundable.)
- * The School's Administration will assign the student to the appropriate grade level.

OUR PRODUCT

We follow a combination of American and Bahamian textbooks which help us deliver sound Christian education mainly, ABeka, Houghton Mifflin Harcourt, ACSI and Social Studies for The Bahamas.

Students are prepared to write national examinations and international standardized tests. The classroom learning is complemented by field trips, guest speakers and retreats.



Core Courses include: Bible, Language Arts, Reading, Phonics, Mathematics, Science and Social Studies. **Special Courses** include: Art & Craft, Computer, Library, Music, Physical Education and Spanish.

Extra-Curricular activities offered during the first and second terms include: Basketball, Choir, Computer, Cooking, Dance, Discovery Club, Drama, Mime, Soccer, Spanish, Track & Field (and others from time to time).

Field Trips are a standard part of the school year at all grade levels. These off-campus events are planned in direct correlation to the curriculum. They provide reinforcement of concepts and enhance the learning experience.

Honour Roll is for students in Grades 3-6 who excel in their academic work. This is calculated on grade point average and letter grades.

Tutoring Services are offered and may be arranged through the office.

The average class size is 25 students. Teacher Aides are available at all grade levels.
